STEAMORE, Ill., May 3.—Dr. E. W. Currier, of the firm of Currier Brothers, physicians, died here yesterday, of the measles. The deceased was an excellent physician, an upright man, of a generous, sympathetic nature. He will be buried by the L. O. O. F. to-morrow, of which order he was a prominent member.

NEW ORLEANS, May 3.—Dr. Samuel Chopin, a distinguished surgeon, died of pneumonia last evening, after three days' illness.

BOSTON, Mass., May 3.—William Wirt Warren, aged 47 years, ex-member of Congress, died in Brighton last evening, after a short illness.

ST. LOUIS, May 3.—Eberhardt Anheuser, President of the Anheuser Busch Brewing Company, and one of the oldest and wealthiest brewers of this city, died last night, aged 75 years.

WASHINGTON, May 3.—The funeral of General Samuel P. Heintzelman took place at 9 o'clock this morning. The remains were escorted to the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad depot by a battalion of the Second Artillery. An officer, a non-commissioned officer, and three privates of the Second Artillery accompany the body to Buffalo, where the interment takes place.
